
# The Uithof

The 'Uithof' is the name of the University Campus of Utrecht.



Below, you will find a short description of the most important buildings that you will use during your master's programme. For further information on the Uithof (including shops and restaurants), look <u>here</u>

**PLEASE NOTE**: This document is a mere impression of a possible situation. The Uithof is currently under heavy construction, which causes multiple buildings to no longer be available. The following buildings give an indication of where your lectures and tutorials COULD be - for they have been so for the past years. But by the start of September, this could be entirely different. It is therefore important that you regularly check Osiris (for your online schedule) and Blackboard.

## Opening hours

Opening hours of the Uithof are from 7.15 am to 10 pm. This applies to every building.

### Finding a computer

Utrecht has many students and not enough computers, so it can be difficult to find an unoccupied computer (especially during the examination weeks). You can use the website <u>studyspot</u> to see where the unoccupied computers are located, per building.

Important buildings at the Uithof

Marinus Ruppert/"Ruppert" building



Lectures and tutorials mostly take place in the Ruppert building. Ruppert also has computer rooms that are free to use, especially room 0.38 (at the end of the building). They also have a computer room where you have to be silent.

### Willem C. van Unnik/"Unnik" building



Lectures also take place in 'Unnik Groen', and tutorials take place in the entire building. The first floor of the Unnik building has computer rooms that are free of use.

### **Educatorium**



The Educatorium serves as a connection between the university library, the Unnik building, and the Ruppert building. It has two large lecture halls, but they are mostly for first year students. Additionally, the educatorium has a large canteen where you can buy coffee, lunch, dinner, and (healthy) snacks. The canteen also holds a large amount of comfortable couches and chairs in which you can relax and study.

#### **University Library**



The University Library has been named one of the best libraries in the world. It has six floors that all contain study-tables and computer spaces. Opening hours are: Monday to Friday: 8 am. - 10.30 pm. Saturday & Sunday: 10 am. - 10.30 pm. The library also has personal study cabins, their keys can be acquired at the desk. #### Martinus J. Langeveld/ "Langeveld" building



Some workgroups take place in the Langeveld building, but its main purpose is that it holds the offices of the university professors. The offices of the clinical psychology professors can be found on the H- section and G-section of the building. Their Pigeonholes can be found in the H-section, next to the secretary. The Langeveld building also has computer rooms and a nice set of tables where you can study. Langeveld is a very complicated building, structure wise, so I will give you further information: Langeveld contains 2 square-shaped buildings, and it has 4 wings (see the picture below). Each of these wings has its own indicative letter (or character). Every room number starts with a letter, so if you are looking for room H 1.26, it is located in the H-wing of the building.


The building has 4 floors: 0,1,2 and 3. At the bottom floor (0), the labs are located. The clinical and health psychologists are located at the first floor (1). The number after the letter indicates on which floor you need to be: so room H1.26 is on floor 1, and room G3.30 is on floor 3.



The Education Secretariat Psychology is also located in the Langeveld building: room F.126. Their opening hours are between 11 am and 3 pm.

## University buildings in the city center

Utrecht University houses many different study programmes and faculties, which cannot all be located at the Uithof. Some of them are therefore located in the city center. Because it is possible that some of your lectures or tutorials will be held in one of these locations, I have provided a map of the city center as well.



You can see that most of the buildings are from the faculty of humanities (blue) and the faculty of law, economics and governance (dark red). Also notice the university library in pink (located at the Drift). This library is a bit more classic and elegant looking than the one at the Uithof, but it contains fewer study spaces, so be sure to come in early!
